Scientists in laboratories all over the world are achieving new scientific results in an enormous extend. Many of these results soon become relevant for society and everyday life in various areas. Nevertheless it usually takes long time spans until people become aware of new scientific results. The e.KnowNet project developed an innovative web platform ("Science Tweets", www.sciencetweets.eu), which fosters the flow of new scientific knowledge from the research laboratory to larger, non-expert segments of society in forms suitable for nonformal learning. Up to now "Science Tweets" has a focus on Photochemistry, but the platform as well as the workflow can be applied to various other scientific fields.

At the closing conference the experiences and results of the project will be presented and discussed. Additional highlights will be keynotes by two distinguished experts, David Phillips and Ilan Chabay. The conference will finish with a panel discussion.
